#### Pakistan's First-ever Climate Change Gender Action Plan launched

IUCN comes forward with new commitments and initiatives in its Climate Change Gender Action Plan (ccGAP) to strengthen the resilience of women and girls in the face of climate-related impacts, while aiming to accelerate progress and support gender-responsive climate action plan. IUCN and the Ministry of Climate Change, Government of Pakistan with the financial support of Green Climate Fund, have today adopted a new roadmap to incorporate gender equality and women's empowerment in climate change discourse and actions by launching Pakistan's first-ever Climate Change Gender Action Plan (ccGAP).


<u>Supporting indigenous community on product diversification</u>

## The future of Panthera tigris in Thailand and globally

Overall rhino poaching rates have declined since 2018, and trade data suggests the lowest annual estimate of rhino horns entering illegal trade markets since 2013.


### World Commission on Protected Areas (WCPA)

#### **The IRF Ranger Code of Conduct**




### The IUCN Contributions for Nature platform is live!

#### Youth Awareness Enviornmental Forum established Paryawaran Television (PTV HD)

Youth Awareness Environmental Forum (YAEF/Nepal) initiated Nepal's first environmental television, Paryawaran Television (PTV HD), is now regularly broadcasting 24 hours daily. The main objective is to broadcast programmers on the environment, health, education, Tourism, Documentary, nature and heritage conservation issues.



#### OMCAR Foundation's contribution to Dugong Conservation Reserve in Palk Bay

The long-term work of 15 years for dugong habitats conservation by OMCAR Foundation, along with other Members of IUCN, has successfully been recognised. The state government of India has officially notified in gazette as India's first Dugong Conservation Reserve in Palk Bay, southeast coast of India. Since OMCAR Foundation has become a Member organisation, IUCN has helped to communicate with other experts and organisations through IUCN WCC and RCF sessions and meetings.
